

OCCUPATIONAL HEALTH & SAFETY POLICY

Moore's Furniture Group designs, manufactures, delivers and installs indoor furniture and associated products. The items are primarily constructed from melamine-faced chipboard, medium density fibre-board and other 'wood' products.

The Company, situated on the Thorp Arch Estate, Wetherby, West Yorkshire, is committed to provide safe and healthy working conditions for the prevention of work-related injury and ill health for all persons working for or on behalf of the Company including employees, contractors, visitors and any individual who may be affected by our operations, including during the installation of indoor furniture and products throughout the UK.

Health & Safety can be defined as:

"Free from danger, injury or ill health"
"Providing a secure workplace that protects against harm"
"Ensuring the wellbeing of employees, contractors, visitors and customers"

Through the implementation of a behavioural safety approach, health, safety and welfare is the responsibility of everyone within the Company and is achieved through:

- Ensuring health, safety and welfare are integral elements of the overall Company business plan, whilst maintaining 'World Class Status'
- Controlling the occupational health & safety (OH&S) hazards consistent with the relevant sections of Moore's Occupational Safety, Health & Environmental Policy document and BS OHSAS 18001: 2007
- Ensuring OH&S risks are assessed, quantified, recorded and communicated to the workforce
- Our commitment to: prevent injury and ill health; compliance with all relevant health & safety legislation, legal requirements and other requirements to which the organisation subscribes to, that relate to its OH&S hazards
- Systematically eliminating or, where necessary, establishing and implementing suitable controls to prevent contact with identified hazards, reducing OH&S risks to the lowest possible level, working in line with our policy arrangements
- Safety orientated product design, development, implementation, manufacture, distribution and installation
- Training employees into the correct emergency procedures, as appropriate, and the appropriate methods for: handling and using materials; operating and maintaining plant and equipment
- Reviewing and continual improvement of our occupational health and safety management systems, and OH&S performance in line with best practice and BS OHSAS 18001: 2007 certification
- Undertaking safety inspection and assessments
- The SHE Forum comprising of representatives throughout the organisation; a no blame 'open door' policy at all levels throughout the organisation regarding the reporting of health & safety issues or concerns; encouraging accident, incident and near miss reporting; and 'zero by choice' principles

The occupational health & safety management systems operated by Moore's Furniture Group are in accordance with BS OHSAS 18001: 2007, and as identified for the 'migration' process to BS ISO 45001: 2018 (to be completed prior to March 2021), audited and approved by the British Standards Institution (BSI).
